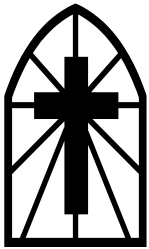

East St. Olaf Council Minutes: December 8, 2025

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order.

Members Present: Pastor Paul Thompson, Gary Kearns, Bryan DeCook, Jane Williams, Terri Ziemann, Danny Ziemann

Devotions: Given at the Joint Meeting.

Pastor's Report: Given at the Joint Meeting.

Secretary's Report: November's minutes were read and approved.

Financial Secretary's Report: Bryan presented the financial statements for Sept., Oct., and November. The reports were read and approved.

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's Report from September was read and approved.

The Total Income for the month was \$7,812.00

Expenses for the month were \$8,314.91. The larger expenses this month included Pastor's salary/pension, insurance for the church, parsonage taxes, electric, phone/internet.

Deacon's Report: December readers are taken care of, and sign-up is in Narthex for readers to sign up.

Trustees Report: The septic tank was pumped, and everything looks good. Still waiting for the painter to come and look at the peeling paint under the balcony. This will be an "indoor" winter job.

Education Report: The Sunday School kids provided the Christmas program at East St Olaf this past Sunday. WELCA served soup and sandwiches, along with lots of desserts. Next Sunday they will be at West. Luther League has a Christmas event coming up at the Hayfield Bowling Alley.

Parsonage Report: Both Carbon Monoxide Detectors need to be replaced due to age, they are over 10 years Old - Pete put new batteries in, but they are still chirping. Dan Williams will pick up a couple. There are some mice in the parsonage, so far 10 have been caught. Gary suggested asking Adams Pest Control Company to take on the Parsonage. He will contact Pete to see if this is a viable solution. Pressure in the boiler at the Parsonage was low, so Pete added water; and bled the air out of the lines upstairs. Working better now (two hour process).

Hans Estby, Norman Senjem, and Mark ?(remodeler) did a walk through the parsonage with Bruce Peterson. Norman Senjem and Nancy Thoreson sent a proposal to the joint committee on a plan for the parsonage. The Council reviewed the written proposal, with the understanding that it would be discussed at the joint meeting, however no action would take place at this meeting as we all need time to look through the proposal more closely.

New Business:

Annual Meeting will take place the 4th Sunday of January (Jan. 25), with the 2nd Sunday in Feb being our back-up date (Feb. 8).

Nominating Committee will be Bruce Peterson and Glenda Mueller.

Spring Dates for church and Lenten Services will be discussed at the joint meeting.

Adjournment: Gary Kearns made the motion to adjourn the meeting, Bryan DeCook seconded. We Adjourned the meeting, and moved to the Joint Meeting.

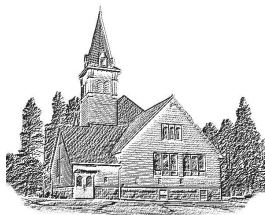
