Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,



Lent is late in arriving this year, but on March 5 we will begin our journey to Easter. I'm sorry I wasn't able to be with you last year, but the topic I've chosen for this year is the one I was planning on for last year. We will take a look at the so-called "Writings". The ancient Hebrews divided their Bible into three main parts, the Torah, the Prophets, and the Writings. The Torah is the first part of the Hebrew Bible, Genesis through Deuteronomy. The second part is the Prophets, which are divided into the Former Prophets (Joshua through 2 Kings), and the Latter Prophets (Isaiah through Malachi). The third part is a group of books we put in the middle, the Writings. They include worship material (the Psalms), historical material (1 Chronicles through Esther) and wisdom books (Proverbs and Ecclesiastes).

My focus will be on that third category. They rarely show up in our 3-year lectionary, only 14 times in those 156 weeks. But they are in our Bible, therefore, they are worthy of our attention. We will talk about how the Psalms fit worship into our daily life, how the Proverbs help us get along with each other and avoid trouble, how Job and Ecclesiastes help us deal with loss and disappointment, and how the Song of Solomon helps us celebrate love.

I look forward to enjoying good food and the Good Book each Wednesday starting with Ash Wednesday, March 5 at East. May this season bring us renewal, growth in our faith, and closeness to our Loving God.


