FIRST READING: Acts 4:5-12: Peter and John had been arrested the previous day because they were proclaiming the news of the resurrection to the people. In today's reading, Peter is filled with the Holy Spirit so that he can proclaim salvation in Jesus' name to the religious authorities.

PSALM: Psalm 23

SECOND READING: 1 John 3:16-24: Jesus' death on our behalf is the clearest demonstration of divine love. This is the very love we share with others, not just through our words but especially through our deeds. In sharing such love we fulfill God's commandments. GOSPEL: John 10:11-18: In language that recalls the twenty-third psalm, Jesus describes himself as the shepherd who cares for his sheep.

He is willing to die for them, and he is able to overcome death for them.
