The twelve seem poor choices to build a worldwide movement: the "first" apostle Peter will deny the Lord three times and the last apostle Judas will betray him to death, while two apostles in between held opposite positions on the Roman occupation (tax collector Matthew worked for them, while Simon the Cananaean or "zealot" worked against them). Nathanel was an intellectual and a bigot. Thomas was 2-faced, ready to die for Jesus when Jesus went to Bethany where his friend Lazarus was dying, but refuse to believe Jesus had returned from death to life. Yet these same blundering fools were entrusted with the work of building the church.

As we sit here in 2025, that Church remains. It is found on every continent, in almost every nation. The Church was even on the Moon when Buzz Aldrin took Communion shortly after his landing from a set prepared for him by his priest before his launch. Christ was taken to the Moon!

We who belong to that church are not done building. The poor are still hungry, the sick are still suffering, and the homeless are still wandering. The work of discipleship does not stop at sundown Sunday night. It doesn't stay safely inside our church's walls.

The message of life for all does not end Easter Day. It does not end at the end of the Easter season, June 8. It never ends! And neither does our charge to tell the world, everyone in it, that Christ is Risen.

EAST COUNCIL MINUTES April 1, 2025

Call to Order: President Randy Robinson called the meeting to order.

Members Present: Pastor Paul Thompson, Randy Robinson, Gary Kearns, Bryan DeCook, Jane Williams, Mary Madson, Meghan Oman, Terry Zieman, Danny Zieman, Pete Exe, Dan Williams

Devotions: Pastor Paul led us in Devotions and Opening Prayer.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Paul provided a print out of his pastoral duties. We discussed the Palm Sunday Procession, and future New Member Sunday dates.

Secretary's Report: The minutes from March meetings read / approved.

Financial Secretary's Report:

A total intake for February was \$12,615.34, and March was \$9, 451.00. (\$ 9,281.00 + \$170 undesignated). These reports were read an approved. **Treasurer's Report:** The Financial Report from March read and approved.

The Contributions to the General Fund, as of Mar 25 was \$9,281.00

Expenses for the month were \$7,401.57. The largest expenses this

month included fuel,

Insurance, phone and fiber, and salaries. Gary and Jane received thank you's from Channel One and the Women's Shelter for our Benevolence Disbursement last month.

Deacon's Report: Terry sent out cards to people brought to her attention. The sign-up sheet for readers is in place at the back of the church. Pastor Paul will be reading all lessons on Easter Sunday. Easter Books and cards were mailed out to our Baptismal Kids as reminders of the season.

Trustees Report: Pete and Tracy fixed up the siding on the West side of the church. Danny Z fixed a broken pew, and attention was brought to paint peeling from the ceiling in the back of the sanctuary.

Education Report: Meghan reported that the Luther League had a lock-in, and are providing a meal at the Ronald McDonald House. An Easter Egg Hunt will be at West on Palm Sunday.

Old Business: Parsonage Project Update:

Randy and Bryan met with the TCPA about adjusting Boundary Lines into three sections; farm/cabin/Parsonage Park. A motion was made by Jane Williams to add 3 acres of wooded land to the 37 acres of farm land to make it a buildable property and increase the value. Seconded by Mary Madson. Motion approved.

The application cost to change the boundaries is \$816.00. A motion was made by Jane Williams to set aside \$1, 000 for costs associated with boundary changes. Pete Exe seconded. The motion was approved. Randy and Gary will keep track of the costs associated with this project separate.

Randy contacted the Byron Fire Department (Paul Ryan) about the possible use of this building in fire training. They are interested. There would need to be asbestos abatement before the burn. Pete will contact Casey and check on asbestos issue. BFD would handle the permits and would also burn the granary and the garage. The cost to us would be \$750 for the burn.

Randy is contacting Will Laxen, West President, and requesting to be on their Council Meeting Agenda for April. He will also contact the Parsonage Committee. We also need to notify the Heritage Committee that came forward last year wanting to purchase the land under the cabin.

The current goal is to meet with the Rock Dell Township in May, for Boundary line adjustment.

New Business: Mary motioned we bring back "Share the Peace", which was stopped during Covid. Pete Exe

seconded. Motion passed. Synod Assembly participants will be switched from Mike and Sue

Senjem to Pat Cahill. Pastor Paul will be attending. Gary will send in registration and fees.

Meghan Oman made a motion to send \$100 for a Synod offering (past practice). Bryan DeCook seconded. Motion Approved.

Adjournment: Motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Bryan DeCook and seconded by Dan Williams.

The meeting ended with the Lord's Prayer.

WELCA served Lenten supper on 4/9 and this Thrivent sponsored event was well attended raising \$265, which will be donated to the Hayfield food pantry. Thank you to the ladies who cleaned the church for service on April 6th. Thank you to Debbie and Laura-Lee for serving coffee on March 30th. The council will serve again on April 27th.
